- Technological developments and innovation




Open data as the cement in our focus

- Transparency
 - Strengthen good public administration: accountability and integrity
- Re-use of open data
 - Opportunities for societal challenges: unexpected innovative solutions
 - Potential economic growth





Definition of open data



Open data is public government information, which can be reused without limitations (free of charge, machine readable ect.)



Current status and development Open data in the Netherlands

- 2500 datasets available
- Before the end of 2014 approximately 6000 datasets available
- Working on more concrete open data policy
- Working on solving legal aspects

 - Mainly focussing on privacy and public safety



 - Fear of influence data on policy and politics


