Appointment of 24 experts to the Committee of Experts on Public Administration

Note by the Secretary-General

1. Subsequent to his note dated 17 February 2009 (E/2009/9/Add.11), in which he proposed nominees to serve on the Committee of Experts on Public Administration, the Secretary-General was informed that Wang Xiaochu (China) would be unable to serve as a member of the Committee. His name has therefore been withdrawn for consideration as an appointee.
2. Consequently, the Secretary-General is nominating Hao Bin to serve on the Committee of Experts on Public Administration in his personal capacity for a four-year term beginning 1 January 2010 and expiring on 31 December 2013. Biographical information on Mr. Hao is provided below.

Hao Bin (China)

Hao Bin is Deputy Director General of the Department of International Cooperation, Ministry of Human Resources and Social Security, a cabinet ministry of China responsible for the management of national human resources, social security and public service. Mr. Hao has over 17 years of experience in the field of civil service management in the central Government. He also has broad international experience in the field of public administration. From June 2005 to June 2008, he was Deputy Director General of the Department of International Exchange and Cooperation, Ministry of Personnel. From October 2002 to June 2005, he had worked at the Permanent Mission of China to the United Nations in New York as Counsellor. He was a member of the Chinese delegation from the fifty-seventh to the fifty-ninth sessions of the General Assembly of the United Nations, representative of China to the Fifth Committee, and representative of China to the Second Committee on issues related to public administration. From 2000 to 2002, he led the Chinese delegation, attending the twenty-first, twenty-second and twenty-fourth meetings of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Human



Resources Development Working Group. He also attended several international conferences of the International Institute of Administrative Sciences (IIAS) and the Eastern Regional Organization for Public Administration (EROPA). Mr. Hao holds a Master of Law degree in civil service management from China Foreign Affairs University (CFAU).
