Decentralization

Benefits of decentralization

1. Deepening Democracy

- Training in political leadership and political education
- Promoting citizen participation in democratic governance
- Promoting participation of women in governance
- Improving capacity in governance

Decentralization (cont.)

2. Improving Service Delivery

- bringing services closer to the people
- Involving people in planning
- Involving people in implementation of plans

Decentralization (cont.)

3. Enhancing Economic Development

- Employment generation
- Participation of communities in economic activities

Local Government in Lesotho

Enabling Legislation

1. The Constitution of Lesotho, 1992
 - Section 106 provides for the establishment of local government (leaves details to an act of Parliament)

Enabling Legislation (cont.)

2. Local Government Act, 1997

3. Local Government Elections Act, 1998

Local Government in Lesotho (cont.)

Enabling Legislation (cont.)

Amended in 2004 to operationalize the inclusion of women in local government elections.

Empowerment of women

1. Reservation of Seats

30% seats for women

- Local Government Act amended in 2004 to provide for the election of at least 30% women into councils
- Local Government Elections Act amended in 2004 to operationalize the inclusion of women in local government elections.

Empowerment of women (cont.)

2. Building the capacity of women (training)

3. Married persons equality Act, 2008

58% women were elected in the local government elections of 2005

Land Management and Administration

Produced 54 village settlement layouts in districts:

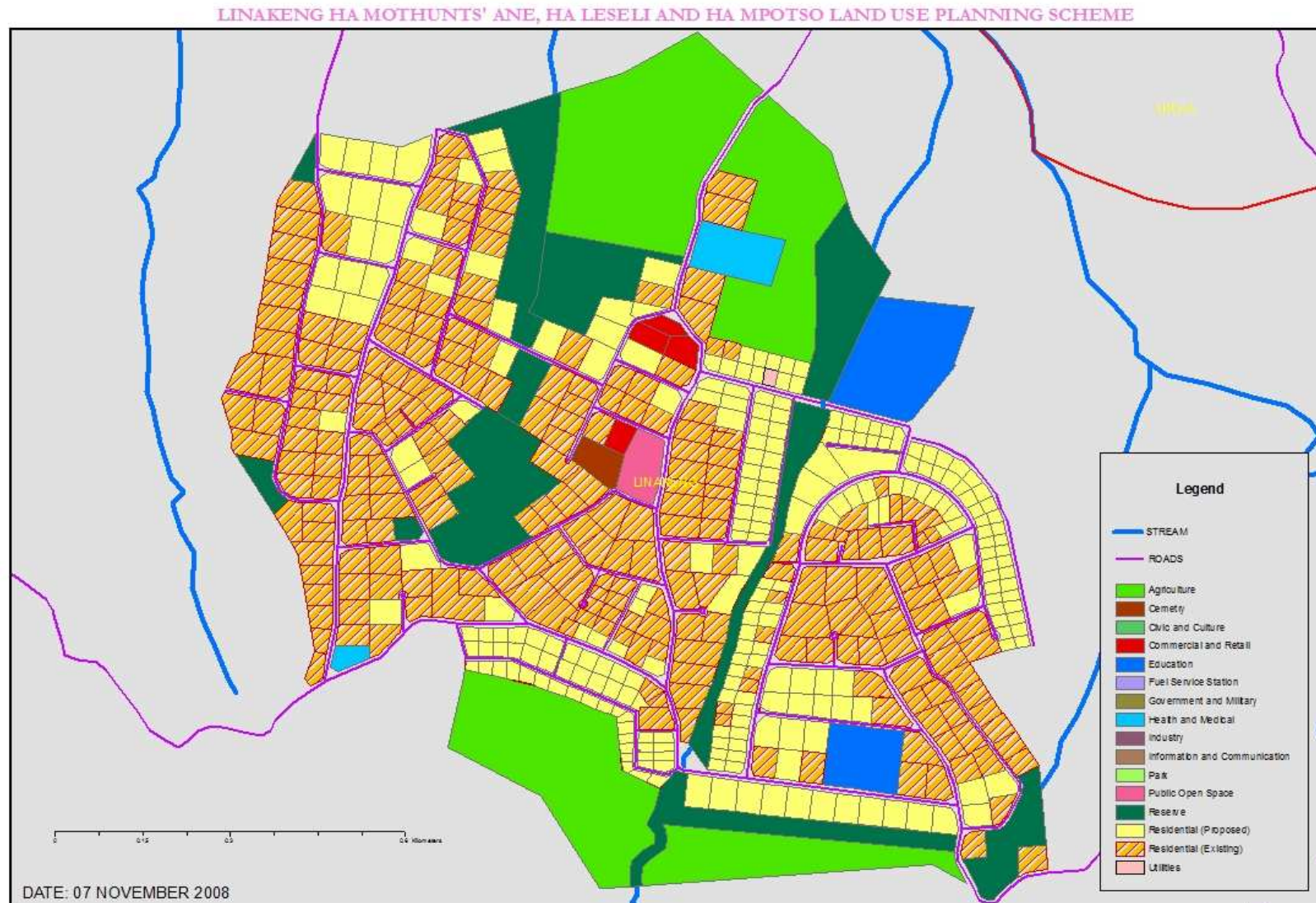
- Botha-Bothe district - 7

Councils have mobilized communities in identifying development plans in the:

Achievements (cont.)

Construction and maintenance of roads:

(a) Rural access roads:

(i) Gravel Roads constructed with heavy plant

Completed 350.7km gravel roads in the following districts:

- Maseru: 35km
- Botha-Bothe: 28km
- Leribe: 40km
- Berea: 31.8km
- Mafeteng: 35.6km
- Mohale's Hoek: 59.1km
- Quthing: 41.5km
- Qacha's Nek: 61.6km
- Mokhotlong: 13.8km
- Thaba-Tseka: 5.3km

Achievements (cont.)

(b) Urban roads:

- (i) **Qacha's Nek.** Constructed and upgraded to bitumen standard 12.25km roads with storm water drainage and street-lighting.
- (ii) **Mohale's Hoek.** Construction and upgrading of 10km urban roads with storm water drainage and street-lighting is in progress and due for completion in May, 2010.
- (iii) **Thaba-Tseka.** Construction and upgrading of 4.5km urban roads with storm water drainage and street-lighting is in progress and due for completion in April, 2010.

Achievements (cont.)

(b) Urban roads:

- iii) **Maseru.** Construction and upgrading of 12km urban roads with storm water drainage and street-lighting at Ha Thamae is in progress and due for completion in May, 2010.
- iv) **Quthing.** Completed design of Quthing 6.6 km roads with storm water drainage and street-lighting.
- v) **Thaba-Tseka.** Completed design of additional 6.2 km roads.
- vi) **Maseru.** Completed design of 15 km roads at Ha Mabote.

Achievements (cont.)

Construction of Council Centres

- (i) Completed construction of seven council centres at Tajane, Ramoetsana, 'Malakeng, Malumeng, 'Makholane, Qibing and Makaota in Mafeteng.
- (ii) Completed construction of all eleven council centres in Qacha's Nek.
- (iii) Construction of ten council centres at Mashaleng, Motlejoeng, Teke, Mootsinyane, Phamong, Qhobeng, Seroto, Likhutloaneng, Nkau and Qabane in Mohale's hoek is almost complete pending finishes that are due for completion by end of April 2010.

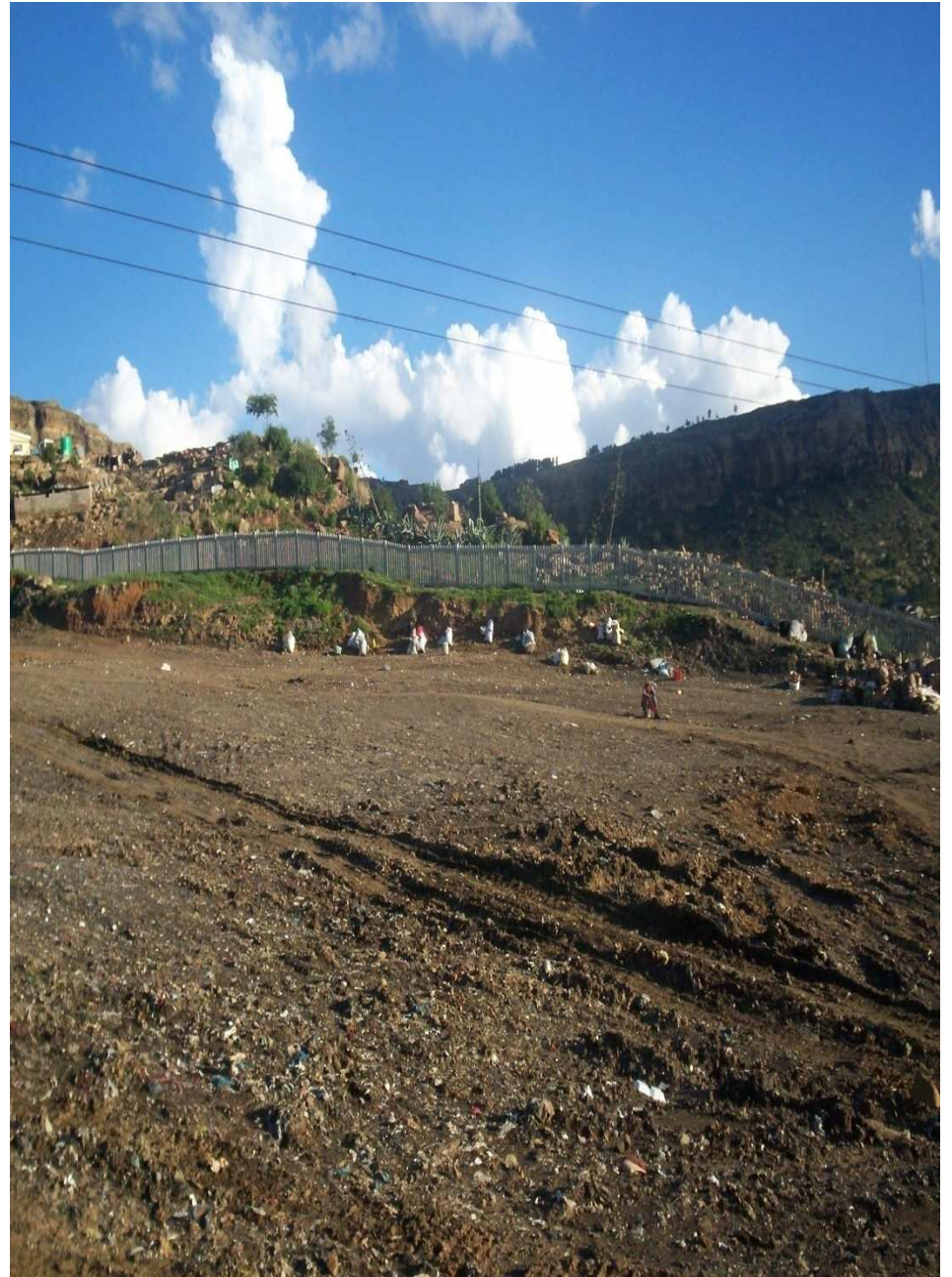
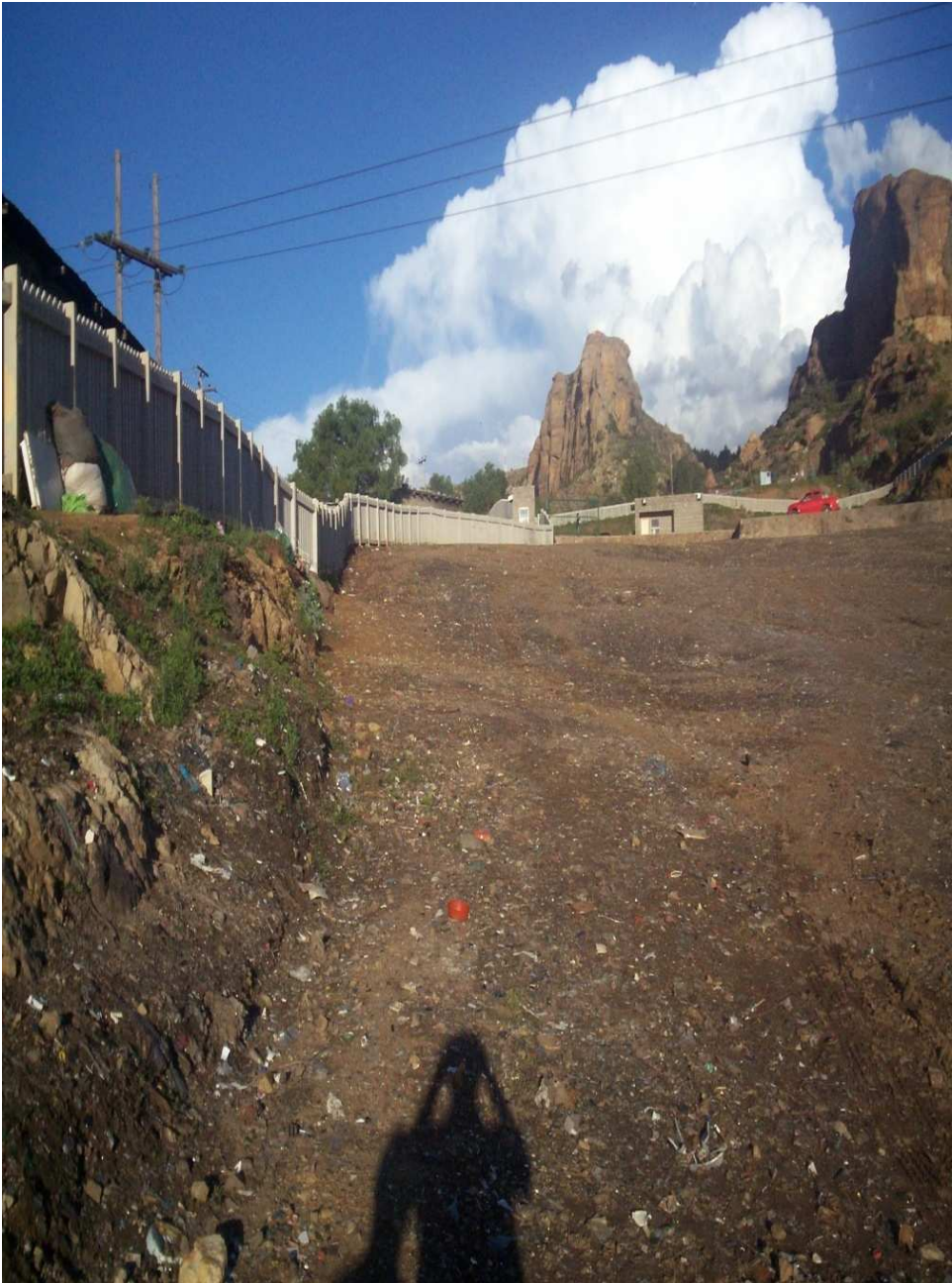
Waste Management and Landscaping
