Over the past 10 months, UNPAN has received an average of over 15,000 visits daily, generating more than 115,000 page views per day, and the number of registered users has now reached 16,000.

In addition, since the upgrade of the UNPAN Online Training Centre in November 2010, there has been an increase in the course completion rate by 65%, five new courses launched, and the UNPAN E-Learning Blog created.

Once again, 'thank you' to all members of the UNPAN family for your significant contributions.

The capacity building theme of this workshop comes at a time when citizens are demanding more from their Governments in terms of access to information. Indeed, Open Government Data will be among the many topics that will be discussed during the workshop. However, I would like to take this opportunity to ask you to also address the following important question during this workshop.
