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**Brief Description:**

This STS will finance two missions for one expert and work for a total of eight weeks to: develop the Uganda National Strategy for mainstreaming ethics, integrity, and anti-corruption practices in all institutions and sectors. It will support the national consultations process, make a draft strategy, organise national consultations, write a second draft, plan and facilitate a national validation workshop, write the final strategy document, assist the national team and national consultant in conducting their respective tasks through ensuring a clear understanding of the concepts and process of mainstreaming strategy and participative strategic planning for them to be able to prepare the new legislation and develop other tools and documentation for further implementation of the strategy.

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## **Background and objectives:**

Within the UNDP and Uganda Country Cooperation Framework for the period 2001 to 2005, there is a Programme for supporting Good governance for Poverty eradication whose PSD was agreed with the Government in July 2001. One of the Immediate Objectives of the Programme is “Increased Capacity of the Inspector General of Government (IGG) and the Directorate of Ethics and Integrity , Office of the President (DEI) and their partners to combat corruption and ensure transparency and accountability in all sectors through promotion of ethics and integrity”. The Department of Ethics and Integrity was identified as the responsibility centre for the development of the National Strategy for Promoting Ethics and Integrity. The main purpose of this STS is to organise national consultation events and facilitate the design and production of the National Strategy

## **Expected deliverable output**

A key output in this was identified as **“a national strategy for mainstreaming ethics, integrity, and anti-corruption commitment in all institutions and organisations in all sectors, public, private, and civic”**. The SPPD project will ensure that the Strategy is designed.

## **Major activities (duties) to be performed:**

The following will constitute the major activities of the SPPD project:

- Conducting a situation analysis on the available information about ethics, integrity, and corruption in Uganda, intervention programs on corruption in place and the channels of communication being used. This will be done mainly through a consultative and participative process.
- The process will pay particular attention to "Reviewing the available information on the state of ethics and integrity in local governments in Uganda with the view to identifying the critical ethical and integrity issues that need to be addressed so that they are included in the overall strategy.
- Write a draft national strategy for mainstreaming ethics, integrity and anti-corruption commitments in all sectors; public, private, and civil society organizations including local governments.
- Organise and support the facilitation of national consultations to discuss the draft strategy and solicit inputs from all stakeholders in all sectors
- Write a second draft of the strategy. The strategy should include a framework for partners to work together and play a central role in rebuilding ethics and integrity in their respective areas of jurisdiction and how to "Facilitate the formation of

- taskforces comprising participating partners as a means of joint decision making and planning"
- Plan and facilitate a national validation workshop where to present the developed National Strategy Document to various stakeholders for validation
  - Produce a final national strategy document highlighting the over all purpose, objectives, strategic actions, partners in the strategy and the roles and responsibilities of each partner, the estimated cost for each identified activity
  - Assist the national team and national consultant (s) in conducting their respective tasks through ensuring a clear understanding of the concepts and process of mainstreaming strategy and participative strategic planning for them to be able to prepare the new legislation and develop other tools and documentation for further implementation of the strategy.

### **Methodology:**

The work will be accomplished using participative methods including meetings and workshops involving a wide spectrum of stakeholders. The Technical Adviser who will lead the work will ensure that the knowledge and skills of situation analysis, strategic planning and facilitation of participative problem analysis and solving workshops are shared with the national team.

### **Duration**

The work will be accomplished in 8 weeks. Two missions of 10 days each will be undertaken in the country by the Technical Adviser.

### **Composition of the National Team:**

The Department of Ethics and Integrity will coordinate a national team to work with the Adviser to accomplish the work. This will facilitate ownership of the Strategy as well as the sharing of knowledge and skills. The National Team will be composed of individuals selected from various institutions in all sectors. These may include: the Government (for example the Public Service Commission, the Inspector General of Government, the Department of Ethics and Integrity, The Judicial Service Commission, The Medical Service Commission, The Teaching Service Commission, The Ministry of Public Service, The Ministry responsible for labour, The Police, The Prisons), Local Governments (for example the Local Authorities Association and the Urban Authorities Association, the Local Government Finance Commission), The Private sector (for example, the Uganda Employers Association, the Uganda Manufacturers' Association, the National Trade Unions), The Civil Society (for example Transparency International Uganda Chapter etc).

## 7: Budget:

The Budget of the SPPD will be fifty-one thousand and four hundred and fifty dollars US (\$51,450).
