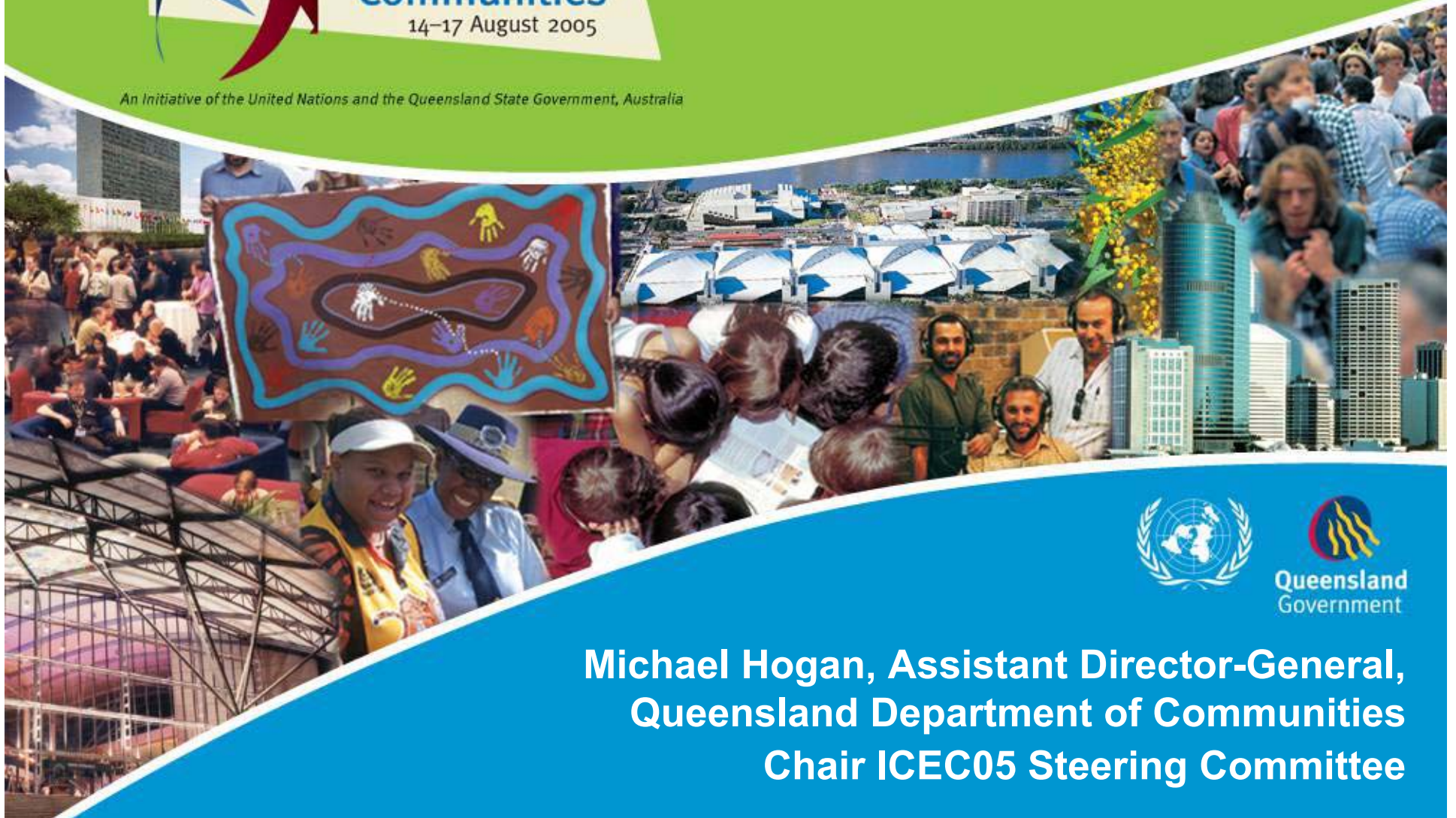

ICEC05 - Queensland context

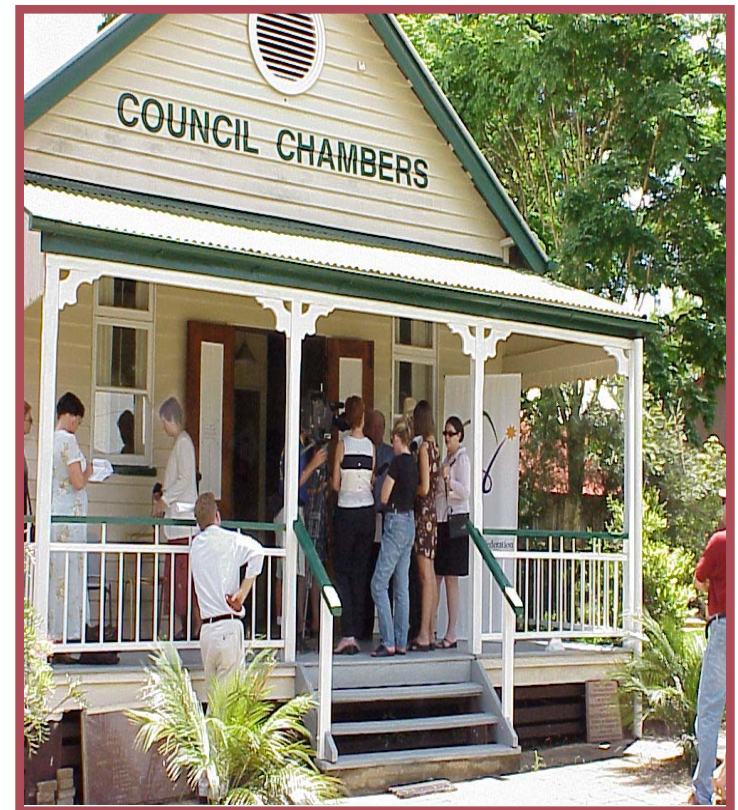
- Qld the birthplace of Australian Labour Party in 1891; Qld celebrates the centenary of women's suffrage in 2005

ICEC05 – development (UN Context)

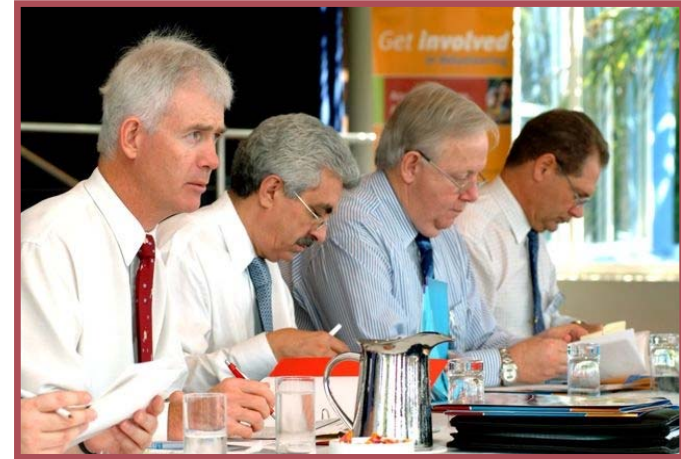
- dialogue between UNDESA and Dept of the Premier and Cabinet from 2002
- agreement in early 2004 between UN and Qld Government to jointly organise a conference
- launch of the inaugural *International Conference on Engaging Communities* by Premier Beattie and Mr Guido Bertucci in Brisbane in August 2004
- support from the Prime Minister of Australia and other State and Territory Governments

ICEC05 – promotion & partnerships

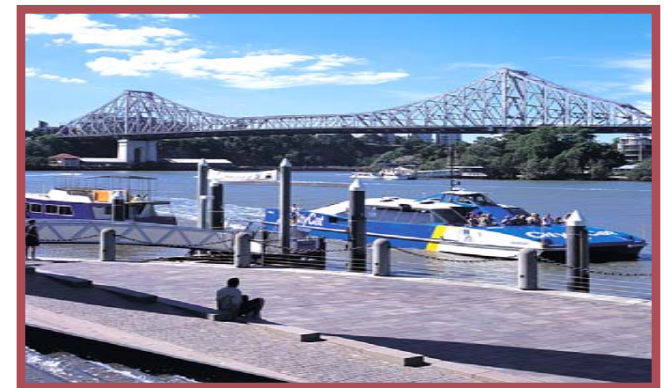
- widespread promotion in conjunction with the UN through international fora & networks

ICEC05 - participation, papers & posters

- 1500 - 2000 participants
- UN supporting 50 participants
- over 670 abstracts received; reviewed by 44 academics & practitioners worldwide
- 300 first round offers
- 30 countries; 1/3 non-Australian
- 9 plenaries; 16 major panels; 100 sessions; web-casting
- Five parallel UN Special Meetings & Workshops
- Premier's Welcome Reception & Conference Dinner & other cultural events
- Exhibition area

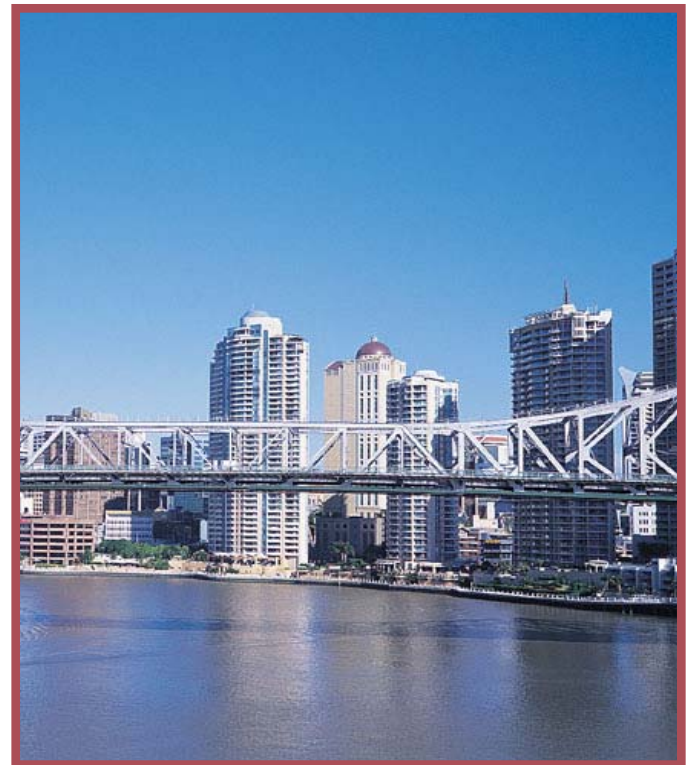
