





Information Age:

Shift from *inline* to *online* systems of 24/7 public service delivery:

- To promote e/m-government service to reduce cost and enhance simplified, efficient, integrated, transparent and accountable operational process
- To facilitate e/m-participation to enhance citizens engagement in economic and social development process
